2024 REGULAR ACTIVITIES

- Attended a Pastor training for four days in the Fall.


2024 ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES • CONTINUED

2024 REGULAR ACTIVITIES

- Preached on a regular basis, ranging from 1-2 times per month.
- Served as an elder.
- Worked with several other churches and ministries with different focuses:
 - NAB Pastors Fellowship meeting every other month with pastors from the Rochester/Buffalo area for encouragement and edification
 - Christ Together a part of the leadership team that works toward collaborating with pastors from the Northtowns of Buffalo
- Serving on the NAB East Home Missions Committee
 - Now also serving as the Chair of this committee
- Met with several men for various reasons:
 - Accountability
 - Counseling
 - Discipleship
- Met with multiple couples for counseling
- Performed pre-marital counseling and performed wedding in July
- Have been a part of Thursday morning men's Bible study and Friday morning accountability group
- Oversaw Greeter ministry, recruiting and training several new greeters
- Oversaw small group ministry; added multiple new small groups and Bible studies
- Led invocations for Grand Island Town Board meetings
- Assisted with the leadership of Fight Club, a men's ministry with over 200 men in the Western New York region
 - Including leading a squad (group) of men from Cornerstone and other local churches
- Met with baptism candidates
- Manage Planning Center, the platform our church uses for database, registrations, small group/Bible study sign-ups, check-ins for youth group and children's ministry, and church directory
- Made visitations to hospitals and shut-ins
- Connected with the community through Grand Island soccer (as a parent), Niagara County Volleyball Club (as a coach and parent), and the Grand Island High School volleyball programs (as a volunteer coach and parent of a girls JV and Varsity player)
- Lead small group that includes 6 families from Cornerstone Church

2024 REGULAR ACTIVITIES

- Hosted a men's breakfast
- Managed our social media accounts (Facebook page, Facebook groups, and Instagram)
- Communicated on a regular basis (typically every week) to our church via email updates that included announcements and sign-ups/registrations
- Participated in Blue Ocean, a leadership development cadre with the NAB, which included multiple three-day retreats (Rosedale, California, and Chicago, Illinois)
- Planned, prepared, and ran two sand volleyball leagues
 - Co-Ed Recreational League 9 teams, over 70 people, ages 13+, from different churches and the local community; this also included recruiting referees and other volunteers
 - Girls' Junior 4's League 6 teams of local high school players from Western New York
- Ran youth volleyball events during several times throughout the year, consisting of tournament play, skill instruction, and devotion time to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ through sports

SUNDAY DISCOVERY ISLAND

- We use The Gospel Project on Sunday mornings and the kids are growing in their knowledge of the Bible. I continue to be amazed at how much they learn.
- I will continue to offer Bible Studies for kids in the fall. I had opened it up to kids from 4th-9th grade and we had 20 children that came on Sunday's right after church September-December.
- We have a full roster of teachers for Sunday mornings, and I will be looking for a handful of subs that I can utilize throughout the year as things come up.

DISCOVERY ISLAND KIDS CLUB

Kids Club is a wonderful ministry for Cornerstone kids and community kids. We continue
to have a very committed team of leaders, and they really pour into the lives of the kids
from September-May. For 2024-25, we have 90 children enrolled and we average
around 78 children every week.

JERUSALEM MARKETPLACE

• Jerusalem Marketplace, which will take place the week before Easter this year, is a kid's version of the Passion Week. The lower level of the church will be transformed into first century Jerusalem and children will experience sights, sounds, smells and tastes of Jerusalem as we tell the incredible story of Jesus journey to the cross.

FASTRAK

• We are holding FASTRAK in June of 2025 to be a local outreach to community kids K-5th grade. This is a free event where kids will bring their Hot Wheels and/or Matchbox cars to race on a custom-made track! Kids will enjoy hearing from race car drivers, crafts, lunch, games, Bible Story and Racing!

SUMMER JAM VBS

• We are planning to run VBS at the Lighthouse Women's and Children's ministry in Niagara Falls this August 2025. We will be brainstorming with Joanne Lorenzo to see how we can encourage the neighborhood kids to come. We were NOT able to run it last summer (2024) due to some medical issueS with those of us planning it.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION

• We had a wonderful volunteer appreciation event during spring 2024. We bonded over Family Feud with a lot of laughs and TV dinners! We are going to hold another event this March, but we can't tell you the theme...it's a surprise! You can thank Michelle Giambra for all of the fun and frivolity. CORNERSTONE CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING

 This year we will continue to safeguard our children having those working with children, youth or vulnerable adults trained through Plan to Protect. We will hold training for first time volunteers and refresher training for those who have already attended the training in the last three years.

FAMILY SERVICES

 This past year, and continuing this coming year, we are incorporating more family services- landing on one per quarter. The purpose of these services is for the kids to see the adults in their lives worshipping the LORD and hearing from his Word, but also for the adults to see the children - those that need to be taught and molded and prayed for. I believe these services can be a nice combination of a regular adult service and a children's service.

ROCKSTAR MINISTRY

- We continue to work towards developing and reimagining our Rockstar Ministry so that
 we can serve not only children in Children's Ministry but to expand to include all
 individuals in our community who are considered differently-abled (developmentally,
 physically or with a mental health diagnosis; ADHD/ADD) to have a place to hear the
 Word of God in a safe and inclusive.
- Michelle Giambra will be attending Disability & The Church, spring 2025 in Washington DC and it is our prayer that she comes back excited and with ideas that we can implement.

DIRECTOR OF WORSHIP MUSIC - JON DALBO

Cornerstone's music ministry exists to create an atmosphere of authentic; spirit-filled; truthful worship of Jesus (John 4:23-24). Psalm 100:1-5 provides an awesome example of what this sort of authentic worship looks like:

SPECIFIC UPDATES FROM THE PAST SIX MONTHS OF 2024

- In collaboration with the tech director and preaching team, contributed towards the implementation of weekly worship services

- Introduced different instrumental combinations to incorporate diverse sound textures
- Composed musical parts for certain songs used in worship services
- Worked closely with the tech director to refine the Sunday sound for both in-person worship and the live stream
- Provided worship for high school youth group's weekly meetings
- Added 6 new volunteer musicians to the team (Currently 18 volunteer musicians actively serve on the worship team)

- Researched and learned new worship songs to introduce into corporate worship
- Provided worship for the leadership retreat

- Lead Impact Sports Ministry.
- Ran two 10-week programs on Saturdays
- Basketball program (January March)
 - 160 athletes participating
 - 45 volunteers
 - Every week, we made sure to share the Bible with all our registered athletes.
- Flag Football program (August October)
 - 179 athletes participating
 - o 63 volunteers
- Took a poll to see how many of our athletes attend church and how many do not.
 - $\circ~$ Over 65% of the athletes in our program come from unchurched households.
