Looking back at 2023:

<u>Donna Linenfelser - Children's Ministry Director 2023</u>

Sunday Discovery Island:

- We continue to use The Gospel Project on Sunday mornings and the kids are growing in their knowledge of the Bible. I continue to be amazed at how much they learn.
- I am continuing to offer Bible Studies for kids. I have opened it up to kids from 3rd-8th grade and we have 17 children interested in coming on Sunday's right after church January-April.
- This year I have been faced with a bit more recruiting than I have in past years, as we have had three teachers step down. The LORD will continue to provide.

Discovery Island Kids Club:

Kids Club is a jewel for children's ministry. We have a very committed team of leaders, and they really pour into the lives of the kids from September-May. Last year, we started out with very high numbers (around 120) and lots of excitement, but we did lose many kids during the year - ending the year with around 80 kids. Those that stayed had a great club year! This year we started off with a good number of kids (around 90) and have felt very encouraged that the community is sending their kids...and we are having a wonderful year.

Jerusalem Marketplace:

For the past two years we have held Jerusalem Marketplace the week <u>before</u> Easter while the kids are on Spring Break. This is a kid's version of the Passion Week in a VBS type experience. In 2024, Grand Island schools have off the week <u>after</u> Easter – Jerusalem Marketplace will be a new experience of what happened after the resurrection through Pentecost.

Summer JAM VBS:

This past summer we held a VBS at the Lighthouse Women's and Children's ministry in Niagara Falls. The turnout was smaller than we had planned for with sometimes only having 20 kids show up. We will be brainstorming with Joanne Lorenzo again this year to see how we can encourage the neighborhood kids to come. We plan on running this VBS for four days in the beginning of August.

Assistant and Training:

- In January 2023 we hired Michelle Giambra as my assistant and she has done an amazing job helping me, Cornerstone Church, and our children's ministry.
 She has a ton of energy and creativity and has been a huge asset.
- January 2024, Michelle and I are both heading to Florida for a children's ministry conference. We are so appreciative of this opportunity.

Volunteer Appreciation:

This spring we will have a volunteer appreciation night at church. The last time we had an appreciation event was in 2018 and I am looking forward to "thanking" all my volunteers with an appreciation event.

Cornerstone Child Protection Training:

As we continue to do all we can to make sure that Cornerstone is a safe place, this past year I became certified as a "Trainer" for Plan to Protect. I plan on having training for our volunteers in January and February of 2024.

Family Services:

This past year, and continuing in 2024, we are incorporating more family services - landing on one per quarter. I think it's working well. I'd like to see the vision for it be clearly communicated as a time where kids see the adults in their lives worshipping the LORD and hearing from his Word, but also for the adults to see the children - those that need to be taught and molded and prayed for. I believe these services can be a nice combination of a regular adult service and a children's service.

Colton Lackey - Youth Pastor 2023

Average weekly attendance:

Senior High: 20 students a week

Middle School: 27 students a week

80 individual students on our roster of kids we've regularly seen this past year

Youth Group Nights:

Youth Group nights have been great this year. We reincorporated worship at both HS and MS doing one song a week. We also added a time of public Scripture reading, which a student leads each night. Attendance has been quite the same as we have a clear group of core students. The High School students have blossomed in many ways this year, the spiritual growth has been incredible to witness. Middle School has been operating great as well. This year we walked verse by verse through Romans, which was a fruitful teaching series. We are starting James in the new year.

Baptisms:

We saw 6 students baptized this year (Tanner Hawley, Leah Hurley, Zach Vinkle, Grayson Rastelli, Hannah Rastelli, and Josie Jackson). This was a great encouragement to all. Each student made a very credible confession of faith and shared their testimony with the church upon their baptism.

Bible Study:

We have continued High School Bible Study this year. Something new we have done is separate the guys and girls. The boys are going through Acts, and the girls are going through Genesis. This has been a great success and I believe it has been the most impactful part of our youth ministry.

Discipleship:

I meet with two young adults in our congregation and have been for the past year. I am not currently meeting with any students one-on-one but am searching for opportunities. However, our HS Bible Study has been a great personal disciple-making tool for our students.

Middle School Option:

Middle School Option continued as normal this year; we are postponing Middle School Option for the time being as we want students to engage with our summer camp memorization program which involves doing sermon notes during our Sunday

gatherings. We will re-evaluate after June. My prayer is to have students engaged and a part of corporate worship with the adults on Sundays.

- Winter Comps (Partner Event with other Youth Groups in WNY) February
- NTS Camp July
- 8 Days of Hope July
- Mission Campus (See You at the Pole Event) September
- Reverb November
- Christmas Cookie Decorating and Party December
- Youth Leaders hosted a few various small group parties throughout the year.

Serving Opportunities:

We had a few serving opportunities this year, 3 of our serving activities were fundraisers for NTS camp (Serving Boba Tea at Impact Celebration, Babysitting Night, & Church Workday). We served 4 full days with 8 Days of Hope, we had 15 different students join us. During Christmas, we decorated and made cookies to contribute to Feed the Falls with the Niagara Rescue Mission.

Preaching:

This year I was more involved in the preaching rotation. I spoke on 11 Sundays at Cornerstone, once at Niagara Community Church. This year I intentionally devoted more time to my sermon prep and communication skills. I feel that I grew a lot as a speaker this year and am seeking to continue to develop more as I hope to be preaching regularly in my future ministry.

School/Ordination:

This year I completed my BA in Christian Thought and Practice in April. Following that I spent May-August pursuing and studying ordination through the North American Baptist Conference. In October I enrolled at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. I am pursuing a Master of Divinity degree with a focus on Greek and Biblical Theology.

Young Adults Study:

I help oversee and guide our young men's small group. This year we went through the book of Romans and Ephesians; we have about 8 young men regularly in our meetings on Sunday.

2023 Goals:

- Finish School and become a Pastor. (Successful)
 This year I completed my BA in Christian Thought and Practice from Kairos
 University (Sioux Falls Seminary), and I was ordained in August through the NAB
 Conference.
- Read 10 books. (Successful)
 I read 27 books this year. Lots of Christian literature and classics.
- Provide a weekly Bible reading plan with students. (Successful)
 We are starting a Bible reading program for students to earn money for their summer camp. This plan will take any student who participates through the entire New Testament.
- Help cultivate a stronger prayer culture in our youth ministry. (Successful) This is a tougher metric to evaluate, overall, I do believe our students' willingness and participation in prayer, specifically corporate prayer has improved, but I believe we still have a lot of room to grow in this part.

2024 Goals:

- See 5 students get baptized, also continue to encourage our older students to attend our membership class and become members as a next step.
- Complete 8 or more seminary courses
- Develop some type of next-step teaching/development for Middle School Students.
- Train up a student or young adult, with the intention of providing teaching opportunities for them at youth group.

Sam Eichel - Music and Arts Director 2023

A large focus for me in 2023 was to reincorporate some of the great songs of the Christian faith and introduce new songs that hold deep theological truths. This included a lot of reading and digging into the reason we sing in church, looking into the commandments in Scripture surrounding worship, and discerning which songs fit into those criteria. This led to re-introducing several hymns, as well as 5 contemporary songs.

I completed a few tech projects (with some assistance) this year to make some much-needed upgrades. The largest project was the replacement of our Sanctuary dimmers, which control all the stage lights. Our stage lights were creating lots of noise and feedback, and replacing the dimmers reduced this significantly. Other projects included researching, buying & installing new speakers and cables for both the DI room and Sanctuary, as well as setting up new TV's in the Sanctuary & DI room.

2023 also consisted of many extra events that fall outside my normal weekly obligations. The most notable events were:

- Preparing and teaching 4 lessons at youth group
- Help coordinate & run tech for:
 - o <u>2 church events</u> (Impact closing rally, Women's Christmas event),
 - o 1 wedding (Kody & Victoria Elinski), and
 - 4 funerals (Kathy Asbach, Nicole Richard, Concetta Desimone, Kathy Jakab)
- Audio/Visual demonstration with homeschool co-op

For spiritual development, I met weekly with one of our young adults. We finished 1 Samuel this past year and started going through the Gospel according to John, which we are continuing throughout this year. I also attended the Ligonier Conference at Redeemer University in Hamilton, ON, which was a great weekend of Bible teaching & spiritual encouragement.

Goals from 2023

- Continue to develop my guitar, bass & vocal skills successful
- Disciple at least 1 more young man/group of young men **semi-successful** I met with a young man weekly for a couple months, but it eventually fell through. I also approached a youth student about meeting, but he declined

- Teach at least twice this year, whether it be Teaching Tuesday or teaching for Youth Group - successful
 I prepared and taught 4 youth lessons in 2023
- Recruit at least 1 volunteer for worship team (could use a drummer, bass player or electric guitar player) - successful Recruited Adam Vinkle for drums, Noah Poczciwinski for keys/drums/video
- Type up a written document on my philosophy of ministry through music to help myself more clearly define my role & purpose - not successful
 Though I did not type up a document, I did spend much time this year reading about proper Christian worship and the significance of worshipping corporately through music

Goals for 2024

- Read at least 10 books by well-known Christian authors
- Make greater efforts to connect with people in our church that are not part of my normal circles
- Recruit a vocalist, electric guitar, or bass player for the worship team
- Attend at least 1 professional development event for worship leading or audio/visual
